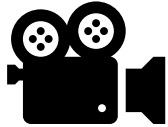

Background / Context

- To meet growing service demand, NHS policies highlight the increasing need to establish innovative care models and develop advance roles to contribute to the workforce transformation agenda.

Challenges

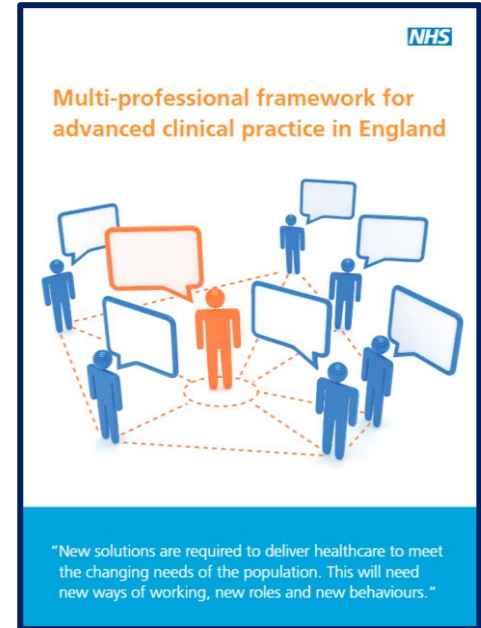
Historically advanced practice (AP) roles have been developed as a reactive service response resulting in disparities between,

- Educational standards / Quality of supervision
- Organisational governance / Competencies and capabilities
- Job descriptions / job planning and pay bands

Raising concerns regarding the professional and organisational liability of practitioners working at this level.

Centre of Advancing Practice

- Set standards for advanced level practice education and training
- Accredite HEI ACP programmes
- Develop independent and supported portfolio route
- Develop multi-professional credentials
- Lead on policy development
- Support and recognise trainee ACPs, advanced and consultant level practitioners
- Promote public and peer confidence in advanced practice
- Maintain public directory of advanced practitioners



Regional Faculty

The EoE Faculty will lead and promote advanced practitioners as part of the workforce solutions that support service changes and work with local systems to identify demand, commission high quality education and training and vitally to support the supervisory needs of learners.

- Ensure a consistent understanding of Advanced practice roles.
- Ensure that Advanced Practice is embedded across all agendas and enabling functions, e.g., apprenticeships, business intelligence, commissioning, finance etc.
- Develop EoE commissioning framework and ACP strategy.
- Ensure robust governance structures are developed across the 6 systems.
- Ensure supervision is provided in line with new national standards.
- Develop a regional directory of ACPs, develop communities of practice, share best practice, and facilitate lifelong learning.

What is Advanced Practice?

‘Advanced Clinical practice is **delivered by experienced, registered health care practitioners**. It is a **level of practice characterised by a high degree of autonomy and complex decision making**. This is underpinned by a **master’s level award or equivalent** that encompasses the **four pillars of clinical practice, leadership and management, education and research**, with demonstration of core capabilities and area specific clinical competencies.

Advanced clinical practice embodies the ability to **manage clinical care in partnership with individuals, families and carers**. It includes the **analysis and synthesis of complex problems** across a range of settings, **enabling innovative solutions to enhance peoples experiences and improve outcomes**’.

Directory of Advanced Practitioners

All Advanced Practitioners will remain under the regulation of their professional bodies and must comply with the relevant codes of conduct.

The Centre for Advancing Practice will maintain a public directory of individuals who have completed a Centre accredited advanced practice programme or are able to evidence their **EDUCATION** and **CLINICAL TRAINING** maps to the Multi professional advanced practice framework.

It will be expected that all APs within the EoE will either be working towards or on the register, supporting appropriate professional and organisational liability and robust governance.

HEE Funding routes

- Full MSc ACP programme funding
 - Need to be in a trainee AP role or working as an AP
- Top up Funding
 - Max 100 credits funded which must lead to a Full MSc ACP award on completion (HEI LNA to ensure prior learning can be accredited)
- Portfolio route
 - Scoping planned early Autumn
